Cultural Misunderstandings

Cultural misunderstandings happen when people have difficulties understanding each other due to cultural differences, even if they speak the same language.

Causes:

- Lack of knowledge about other cultures
- Ethnocentrism
- Communication and cultural differences
- Different views of the world





Common Misunderstandings



LANGUAGE BASED

Caused by linguistic differences.

e.g.: When the same word means different things (e.g.: embaraçada (in Portuguese means 'embarrassed') and embarazada (in Spanish means 'pregnant')).



BEHAVIOUR BASED

Caused by differences in behaviour and non-verbal communication.

e.g.: Shaking your head up and down to mean 'yes' in Bulgaria.



BASED ON STEREOTYPES

Caused by assumptions about the other person based on their culture.

e.g.: assuming a British person is being sarcastic when they are being literal.

Non-verbal Communication

Communication done without recurring to spoken or written words. For example, gestures, facial expressions, eye contact, touch, posture, and appearance.

Non-verbal clues are an essential aspect of communication. The way each person communicates non-verbally is part of their linguistic identity and it varies according to their culture. For example, while in some countries it's common to sit with legs crosses, in others it's considered rude.

Prejudice and stereotypes

Stereotypes are preconceived ideas about a certain group that dictates and standardizes their behaviour or personality traits. Cultural stereotypes are those associated with race,



ethnicity and culture. (e.g.: all Asians are good at Math, all Arabs are terrorists). While some stereotypes are positive, others are negative and lead to the segregation, exclusion of people and prejudice against those from that culture.
